HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE

Choice Pantry: Allows a recipient to choose from an assortment of shelf-stable items and may also include fresh produce, frozen meat, eggs, milk and bread.

Pre-Packed Box Pantry: A pre-packed box (or bag) of an assortment of canned and/or fresh items will be given.

Mobile Market/Pantry: Often a combination of free fresh produce and nonperishable items brought to central locations.

Food Recovery/Gleaning: Excess crops donated by and collected from farmers' fields or excess food donated from commercial outlets (groceries, etc.)

Community Garden: Place for individuals to grow their own fruits and vegetables

Prepared Meal On-site: A hot or cold meal depending on the site.

SNAP: Farmers Markets where SNAP benefits are accepted and that often double the value of SNAP when spent on fruits and vegetables.

Other Support Services: can include referral to additional support services, thrift store, housing, transportation, utilities, case management, social services, workforce development and nutrition counseling. Please contact providers directly for specific information.



Food Type Key: FRESH includes whole fruits, vegetables, and bread REFRIGERATED includes perishable items including dairy and meat. PERSONAL CARE products include items such as toothbrushes and toilet paper.

AVAILABLE FOOD ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS AND SERVICES IN THE NRV

BENEFIT PROGRAMS

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) provides federal assistance to supplement low income families' ability to buy food. To Apply: Online via Common Help <https://www.dss.virginia.gov/benefit/snap.cgi> or an application may be filed in person at the closest Department of Social Service office.

Women, Infants and Children Program (WIC) provides assistance for supplemental foods and other related health services to women who are pregnant or have recently given birth, and infants and children under the age of 5 years old.
